**Re: James Williams Injury - 15256-18**

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I am in receipt of a Supervisor's Investigation from Sgt. Ronald Magsamen pertaining to an injury to a defendant, James Williams. On May 25, 2018 the narcotics unit was working and members were actively looking to arrest James Williams. The narcotics unit had active narcotic sales charges against Mr. Williams in addition to having a search warrant for his person, his residence and his vehicle.

Members of the narcotics unit located James Williams and a vehicle stop was conducted on East Main Street. Immediately Officer Rosen and Sgt Magsamen approached the vehicle, NY Reg [REDACTED], and located James Williams in the driver's seat. James was asked to get out of his vehicle which he refused to do. Officer Rosen began to explain the situation, advising him about the search warrant for him and some of his property. Mr. Williams did not believe the officers and continued to refuse to exit his vehicle. Mr. Williams began to reach for things in his vehicle which caused Officer Rosen, Sgt. Magsamen and State Trooper Inv. Javaheri to act and physically remove Mr. Williams from the vehicle. All officers involved report using soft hand tactics to deal with this situation. James was removed from his vehicle and brought to the ground. During this process, James received a minor abrasion above his right eye and a minor scrape on the bridge of his nose. Sgt. Magsamen reported that he offered James medical attention on a few occasions and he refused every time. On one occasion he stated "he didn't need an ambulance, he will be fine."

Two questions need to be answered: Was the arrest justified and was the force used necessary and reasonable.

**First – Was the arrest justified?**

The narcotics unit had open drug sales charges for James Williams [REDACTED]. The narcotics unit also had a search warrant for James Williams person, his vehicle and his apartment, 58.5 Cottage St. In this case the arrest was justified.

**Second – Was the force used necessary and reasonable?**

The City of Middletown Police Department's policy and procedure governing this question is **AGO-022-11 USE OF PHYSICAL FORCE & DEADLY PHYSICAL FORCE**, specifically Covered under PROCEDURES:

- A) Personnel will use only the physical force or deadly physical force necessary to accomplish The lawful objectives set forth below.

SUB 2

To Affect an Arrest or Prevent an Escape:

- A) An officer. May use physical force or deadly physical force when and to the extent he/she reasonably believes it to be necessary to affect a lawful arrest, or to lawfully prevent a person's escape from custody.

In this case the Officers involved used the necessary and reasonable force. The officers attempted to explain the situation (procedural justice) to Mr. Williams but he did not want to hear what the officers had to say. Mr. Williams believed that he did not have a warrant and it appeared that nothing was going to change his mind. The officers used communication up until Mr. Williams began to reach for something in his vehicle. At this point the officers used soft hand to remove him from his vehicle, take him to the ground and finally handcuff him.

There were no policies violated and I see no issues with the way this situation was handled. I have no Recommendations and do not feel there are any training issues that need to be addressed.

**Re: James Williams Search Warrant/**

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- 1. On 5/25/2018 at approximately 1422 hours, the Narcotics Unit were conducting an "Operation" in the area of East Main Street, within the City of Middletown. Officers had open narcotic sale charges into James C Williams AKA "Mills" (Target #1). Officers also had an active Search Warrant for the Targets residence and vehicle (2005 Land Rover NY Reg [REDACTED]), which he was operating on this date.**
  - 2. Det. Nyland was conducting surveillance on the Target at approximately 1415 hours, and advised members of the Narcotics Unit that he observed the target driving in the above stated motor vehicle on East Main Street.**
  - 3. Members of the Narcotics Unit, along with Inv. Javaheri from the NYSP observed the Target on East Main St, in the area of Woodlawn Ave. Officers conducted a vehicle stop regarding the Open Sales and Search Warrant.**
  - 4. PO Rosen and Inv. Javaheri approached the driver side of the vehicle and Sgt. Magsamen approached the passenger side. PO Rosen identified himself to the target and asked for the targets identification. The target was then advised that officers had a warrant for him and PO Rosen asked the target to exit the vehicle.**
  - 5. The target became agitated and stated to PO Rosen that he doesn't have a warrant and that he doesn't have to get out of the car. The target was then advised by PO Rosen that he was under arrest and to exit the car. Again, the target stated that he wasn't under arrest and was not**

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- going to get out of the car. Officers continued to talk to the target and get him to comply with our requests. The target continued to refuse all of the officers requests and talking with him was not productive.
6. The target then began to reach for items within his vehicle and was asked to stop, for officer safety. The target ignored officers, at which point PO Rosen and Inv. Javaheri attempted to remove the target from the vehicle using soft hand tactics. The target was holding onto the steering with both of his hands. Sgt Magsamen was able to break the targets grip on the steering wheel, at which point the target was physically removed from the vehicle by PO Rosen and Inv. Javaheri.
  7. Once out of the vehicle, the target was refusing to give officers his hands so he could be cuffed. The target was brought down to the ground by PO Rosen, Inv. Javaheri and Sgt. Magsamen. While on the ground, the target was still refusing to give his hands to officers so he could be cuffed. Using soft hand tactics, officers were able to obtain the targets hands and place him in cuffs.
  8. Sgt. Magsamen had the target placed in car #11, at which time I was able to talk to the target about his refusal to cooperate and his injuries. The target stated to Sgt. Magsamen that he didn't mean to fight, and that his lawyer told him that he had no warrants. I also observed an abrasion to the upper right eye area and small cuts on the nose area. I asked the target if he wanted an ambulance to the scene to look at his injuries. The target stated he didn't need an ambulance, and that he was going to be fine. I evaluated the two areas and determined that the injuries were minor in nature. The target was then transported back to 370.
  9. At 370, I asked the target again if he wanted an ambulance, and again he stated that he didn't need one. I allowed the target to clean his cuts with water and paper towels. I asked the target why he was not cooperating, and he stated because he knew he didn't have any warrants. The target was also apologetic to officers and was feeling sorry for not cooperating.
  10. Officers completed a case report, and arrest report for narcotic charges from the investigation, as well as from narcotics recovered from the target. Officers also conducted a Use of Force Form and submitted it for approval. Photos of the target's injuries were also taken for documentation.
  11. Throughout the course of this supervisor investigation, I have found

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**that all officers involved followed department policy and procedures. The vehicle stop was conducted for a valid reason, with officers having probable cause for arrest. PO Rosen and Inv. Javaheri utilized constraint and used verbal judo while dealing with the target, which in my opinion de-escalated the police contact from the start. The use of force used by the officers was authorized and necessary in this instance, when dealing with uncooperative subjects. All force was documented and the appropriate steps were taken in the aftermath of the incident. It is important to the success of our officers that we continue to provide officers with training, constant awareness of use of force situations and debriefing's after the fact, so officers can remain safe and know how to deal with these incidents.**

## ADDITIONAL NARRATIVE

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FELONY SALES CHARGE IN ADDITION TO WILLIAMS BEING THE TARGET OF A SEARCH WARRANT (INCLUDING WILLIAMS'S PERSON, THE ABOVE MENTIONED VEHICLE AND WILLIAMS RESIDENCE, 58.5 COTTAGE STREET). OFFICERS CONDUCTED A VEHICLE STOP WITH THE ABOVE MENTIONED VEHICLE. WILLIAMS CONFIRMED HIS IDENTITY VIA NYS DRIVERS LICENSE. WILLIAMS WAS ADVISED THAT HE WAS UNDER ARREST, HOWEVER REFUSED TO EXIT HIS VEHICLE. WILLIAMS BEGAN REACHING AROUND THE INTERIOR OF HIS VEHICLE AND TOWARDS HIS POCKETS. OFFICERS ADVISED WILLIAMS TO STOP REACHING FOR ITEMS. R/O, OFFICER ROSEN AND TROOPER JAVAHERI PHYSICALLY REMOVED WILLIAMS FROM THE VEHICLE AND ONTO THE GROUND. WILLIAMS CONTINUED TO STRUGGLE WITH OFFICERS WHILE ON THE GROUND, REFUSING TO REMOVE HIS ARMS FROM UNDERNEATH HIS BODY. USING SOFT HAND TACTICS OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO HANDCUFF WILLIAMS, WHICH WERE DOUBLE LOCKED AND CHECKED FOR FIT. OFFICERS CONDUCTED A SEARCH OF WILLIAMS FOR WEAPONS. OFFICER ROSEN LOCATED A BUTTERFLY KNIFE IN WILLIAMS FRONT LEFT POCKET AND TROOPER JAVAHERI LOCATED A PLASTIC BAG CONTAINING WHAT APPEARED TO BE CRACK COCAINE (9.6 GRAMS) IN WILLIAMS RIGHT CARGO POCKET. OFFICERS ALSO LOCATED WILLIAMS CELL PHONE AND \$150.00 ON WILLIAMS PERSON. OFFICER MIRKO ARRIVED ON SCENE AND OFFICER MIRKO AND OFFICER ROSEN TRANSPORTED WILLIAMS TO 370 IN MARKED UNIT 11. WILLIAMS VEHICLE WAS TRANSPORTED TO 370 BY SGT. MAGSAMEN.

ONCE AT 370 OFFICER ROSEN AND OFFICER MIRKO CONDUCTED A STRIP SEARCH OF WILLIAMS, AS PER SGT MAGSAMEN, WHICH YIELDED NEGATIVE RESULTS.

DURING THE COURSE OF WILLIAMS ARREST HE DID SUFFER A SMALL ABRASION OH HIS FOREHEAD AND NOSE. SGT MAGSAMEN PHOTOGRAPHED AND DOCUMENTED WILLIAMS INJURIES. WILLIAMS REFUSED FURTHER MEDICAL ATTENTION.

AS A RESULT OF THE ABOVE INVESTIGATION, OFFICERS FROM THE CITY OF MIDDLETOWN NARCOTICS UNIT HAD ALREADY OBTAINED A SEARCH WARRANT SIGNED BY THE HONORABLE JUDGE STEVEN W BROCKETT ON MAY 24TH 2018 OUT OF THE MIDDLETOWN CITY COURT FOR JAMES WILLIAMS, HIS VEHICLE (2005 LAND ROVER (NY HVH5138) AND HIS RESIDENCE, LOCATED AT 58.5 COTTAGE STREET, APT 2, MIDDLETOWN NY.

AT 1510 HOURS, MEMBERS OF THE CITY OF MIDDLETOWN NARCOTICS UNIT AND NYSP, EXECUTED THE ABOVE SEARCH WARRANT ON THE ABOVE RESIDENCE.

OFFICERS MADE CONTACT WITH A FEMALE INSIDE THE RESIDENCE, IDENTIFIED AS BLESSING ROGERS.

OFFICERS CONDUCTED A SEARCH OF THE RESIDENCE. OFFICERS RECOVERED THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:

- 31 GRAMS OF PRESUMED MARIJUANA IN A PLASTIC BAG, LOCATED IN A BOOK BAG IN THE LIVING ROOM (RECOVERED BY DET NYLAND)
- 23 GRAMS OF PRESUMED MARIJUANA IN A PLASTIC CONTAINER, LOCATED IN A BOOK BAG IN WILLIAMS BEDROOM (RECOVERED BY R/O COLLETTI)
- \$11,000.00 US CURRENCY (96 ONE HUNDRED DOLLAR BILLS AND 28 FIFTY DOLLAR BILLS) WRAPPED IN A RUBBER BAND LOCATED INSIDE A JACKET POCKET IN WILLIAMS BEDROOM (RECOVERED BY R/O COLLETTI)
- PACKAGING MATERIAL, LOCATED IN THE KITCHEN (RECOVERED BY OFFICER MCCANN)

AT 1600 HOURS, MEMBERS OF THE CITY OF MIDDLETOWN NARCOTICS UNIT AND NYSP,  
EXECUTED THE ABOVE SEARCH WARRANT ON THE ABOVE VEHICLE.

OFFICERS RECOVERED THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:

- (2) ROSE GOLD APPLE IPHONES
- (2) BLACK SMART PHONES
- (28) 2019 NYS INSPECTION STICKERS

IN TOTAL OFFICERS RECOVERED 54 GRAMS OF MARIJUANA, WHICH WAS FIELD TESTED BY  
OFFICER MCCANN USING THE NARK DUQUENOIS REAGENT AND YIELDED A POSITIVE RESULT  
FOR THE PRESENCE OF MARIJUANA.

THE PRESUMED CRACK COCAINE WAS WEIGHED AND FIELD TESTED BY OFFICER ROSEN. THE  
PRESUMED CRACK COCAINE WAS FIELD TESTED USING THE COBALT-THIOCYANATE REAGENT AND  
YIELDED A POSITIVE RESULT FOR THE PRESENCE OF COCAINE. THE WEIGH OF THE CRACK  
COCAINE TOTALED 9.6 GRAMS.

THE ABOVE MENTIONED RECOVERED PROPERTY WAS SECURED INTO A MPD EVIDENCE LOCKER.

WILLIAMS WAS BOOKED AND PROCESSED ON PL 220.16-1, PL 220.09-1, PL 221.10-2 AND  
PL 205.30. WILLIAMS WAS PLACED IN A CELL TO AWAIT ARRAIGNMENT.

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ON 05/25/2018, R/O ROSEN ALONG WITH OTHER OFFICERS FROM THE CITY OF MIDDLETOWN NARCOTICS UNIT WERE ATTEMPTING TO ARREST JAMES C WILLIAMS/08-30-1978 FOR ACTIVE DRUG SALES AS WELL AS A SIGNED SEARCH WARRANT FOR HIS PERSON AND HIS RESIDENCE. R/O ROSEN, ALONG WITH PO COLLETTI, INV JAVAHERI, AND SGT MAGSAMEN CONDUCTED A VEHICLE STOP WITH JAMES C WILLIAMS IN THE AREA OF E MAIN ST WITHIN THE CITY OF MIDDLETOWN. R/O ROSEN APPROACHED JAMES AND ADVISED HIM THAT HE WAS UNDER ARREST WHICH HE STATED: "NO I'M NOT". 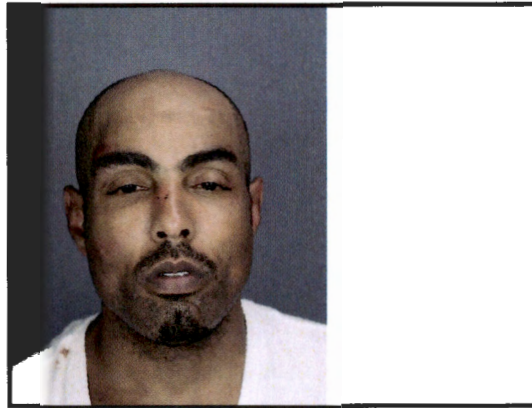
